In Philippians, Paul started giving words of encouragement to all the believers and assuring them of his prayers. Paul was filled with joy as he relayed his beliefs, expressing how much he loves them.

Paul tells them that all they did is the result of God working in their lives. With immense assurance and confidence, Paul has no doubt what the Lord started in their livers. We call this work of God sanctification. When we became a Christian, God begins the work of Christlikeness. When we become Christians, actively choosing to do good deeds, we are essentially becoming more like a Christ.

Good work refers to the process of sanctification, where believers are transformed into self-denial, which is an essential ingredient in the process of sanctification. This is a long journey that requires cooperation with the Holy Spirit.

The verse can be comforting in times of weakness or pain, and inspiring when needing motivation to keep going in faith.

If we are going through a difficult time, we can't be discouraged. It's a sign that you belong to God and that He is faithful to complete the work He started in your life. God has begun good work in us and He will finish what He has started. We are His forever and nothing can change that.



February Outreach




